

Study in Portugal Network (SiPN)

PRE-APPLICATION PROCESS

Please take a moment to read through our summary of some of the key steps required of you.

Talk with your university study abroad office. Part of the application process is obtaining an approval of participation form, signed by your study abroad office. It is important to talk with your school early and often about your program choice, in order that you fully understand your school's policies related to credit transfer, billing, financial aid, and applications; many schools have their own application process, in addition to SiPN's.

Talk with your family and friends. Your family and friends know you best and may be able to help you sort out priorities. It's also important to make sure your family understands your program, the location you've chosen, and the process that you'll go through to apply. You will need their support, and they will want to know about this exciting opportunity.

Think Academically. What are your goals for study abroad and how might SiPN help achieve these goals? Be prepared to articulate your reasoning for your program choice and the SiPN program model on your application.

Think Financially. Study abroad is an important commitment, and financing the experience may not be as difficult as you think. Advance planning will help tremendously. SiPN offers partial scholarships, and many schools have special billing agreements with SiPN. Check with your home institution's study abroad office for more information. SiPN is willing to sign partnership/consortium agreements with your school to facilitate billing and payments.

Apply for a passport.**All students**

All students must have a passport to study abroad that is valid for at least six months after the program's end date. Students should apply for a passport as early as possible. SiPN is happy to speak with students about passport and visa-related questions and concerns.

US Citizens

VISA for US citizens are not required for summer session participants staying less than 90 consecutive days.

Non-US citizens

Non-US citizens should consult with SiPN early to determine the visa requirements based on their country of origin. SiPN cannot guarantee visas for its participants, and it is ultimately the student's responsibility to secure the appropriate visa in a timely manner.

3. SiPN/FLAD Scholarships

Every year SiPN/FLAD awards SiPN participants with \$20,000 in student scholarships. Usually, summer awards are of \$500. The deadline to apply for these is March 10 and are only for students who have already submitted their \$200 program deposit.
